CLUB INFORMATION

Havasu Gold Seekers, Inc. is a non-profit gold seekers club in Lake Havasu City, Arizona with 20 gold bearing claims, covering over 3200 acres.

The Club was started in early 1991 when a small group of Lake Havasu City residents got together for the purpose of recreational gold prospecting in the desert near Lake Havasu City, Arizona. The Club started with about 20 men and women and grew slowly until February of 1992 when Captain Dan McCarty and seven other members formed an association and filed four placer claims totaling 640 acres. At the very next club meeting the Club elected officers and adopted by-laws. The newly elected President, Dan McCarty, Vice-President, Denny Craig, and Secretary, Elaine Babb, had the tough job of making things work well for the benefit of all club members. From that point on the Club has grown to over 350 members. HGS purchased its own land near the claims for Club activities such as family outings, BBQ's, camping and of course, GOLD PROSPECTING!

Havasu Gold Seekers, Inc. meets in the Havasu Room at the Quality Inn & Suites Motel on the first Tuesday of each month at 7:00 p.m. The Board Meeting precedes the general meeting at 6:00 p.m.

From September through May, the Havasu Gold Yearly individual or family membership dues are \$30 and are due by December 31. Family membership includes family members under 18. The initiation fee for a new membership is \$100.. The total cost for new members the first year is \$130 and \$30 thereafter. The dues are used to send out a monthly newsletter, pay miscellaneous expenses, and pay the fees on all of the Club's gold claims

Anyone wishing to join the Havasu Gold Seekers must fill out a Membership Application and a Hold Harmless Agreement. Take your application and agreement to a Club meeting or mail it along with your check to:

COMMON DIG RULES PLEASE ABIDE BY THE FOLLOWING RULES

- No early birds – No buckets filled before start time.
- No equipment within marked area.
- Hand tools such as shovels, picks and buckets in dig holes only.
- NO METAL DETECTORS ALLOWED IN DIG HOLE AT ANY TIME
- No metal detectors or dry washers inside dig area
- Form one line with two buckets per person only.
- Private holes 10x10 OK to claim giving right of way to digger.
- Dirt piles OK for 72-hour private claim, but not in common dig holes.
- Do not cut tree roots or cactus, and as always, leave access open to where equipment is classifying for dirt removal.
- MEMBER'S GUEST NOT ALLOWED TO PARTICIPATE IN COMMON DIGS.

DESERT SURVIVAL

It's a good idea to take a few emergency tools with you each and every time you go out to prospect. An emergency survival kit is best. It can be worn as a small pack on your belt so it is always with you. It must be small enough to be carried with you at all times. Don't add unnecessary items to this kit. Make it small but efficient.

It is also essential that you know how to use the items in your emergency kit before it becomes necessary. The recommended items to add to this kit are of no use if you don't know how they can be used. You must take all possibilities into account.

Make sure your mode of transportation is in good working order. Carry a survival kit, first aid kit and plenty of water in or on your vehicle.

In an emergency situation don't take unnecessary risks. Know your level of skill and stay within your ability to avoid injury to yourself and others.

It is vital that you stay calm and in control. Panic can cause problems that are sometimes deadly. Panic can keep you from rational thinking through an emergency situation. Keep in mind that you do not want to fight the desert. You want to become adaptable and become a part of the desert in order to survive.

. If you are within CB radio range you can call the Havasu Gold Seekers Safety Patrol. They are on channel 14 and can be reached in our claims area. If you do not carry a CB radio with you, and if you have a cell phone you might possibly get a signal from an elevated area. The Safety Patrol phone numbers are on page 3 of this newsletter.

If you experience a vehicle breakdown in an unfamiliar area, it is best to stay near your vehicle. Lift the hood and trunk lid to signal that you need help. Only leave your vehicle if you are absolutely sure you know the route to get help. Leave a note for rescuers with the time that you left the vehicle and what direction you are traveling.

If you decide to walk, be sure that you give yourself a rest period each hour. Depending upon your physical condition, rest anywhere from 10 to 30 minutes. Be aware of where you place your hands and feet. Be certain that you can see the surface to avoid placing your hands or feet near poisonous creatures.

Drink your available water. You should allow one gallon per person per day. Sipping water does not get it to the brain and vital organs. Don't rely on thirst. Drink at regular intervals. People have been found dead in the desert from dehydration with water in their canteens.

If you are short on water, avoid physical output. Avoid talking and smoking. Do not take salt tablets or drink alcohol. Do not eat. Your body uses up your available body fluid to digest food.

Avoid sitting or lying down on the ground. We have plenty of sunshine and the sun will heat up the ground by 30 degrees or more.

Keep your body cool. Cover your head. Do not remove clothing because it helps reduce your rate of dehydration.

Be aware of your body cues and be alert to hyperthermia, dehydration and hypothermia.

Be alert to the weather. Flash floods can occur when there are thunderheads in the sky. The water can come from areas that are a distance away. (To be continued.)

Breakfast Casserole

1 pkg. croutons, crushed
2 cups shredded cheddar cheese, divided
¾ cups sour crème
2 Tbsp. spicy mustard
8 eggs
paprika (optional)

Preheat oven to 350. Press crushed croutons to the bottom of a greased 9 x 13 baking dish. Sprinkle 1 cup cheddar cheese over the croutons. Combine sour cream and spicy mustard; place half the sour cream mixture over the cheese and croutons in evenly spaced spoonfuls. Crumble sausage over top. Beat eggs together and pour over mixture. Spoon remaining sour cream to fill spaces and sprinkle with remaining cheese. Garnish with paprika. Bake 20 - 25 minutes.
